## Presidents' Report (Debra Stephans: MES and Melanie Paxinopoulos: FMS)

- Minutes from the September 2017 meeting accepted.
- Fieldstone Friday will take place on 10/20 for 7<sup>th</sup> grade with DJ and volunteers.
- Fundraisers include FMS Book Fair, Square 1Art Sale (your child's custom catalog featuring their artwork will be coming home soon), Yankee Candle Sale, Carousel Pies & Cakes Sale and Holiday Boutique.
- KidStuff books raised about \$3,000, and Joann Catalfumo is looking for a new chairperson to shadow her next year.

- Back to School Night Bake Sales made a collective \$2,727.50, which was a \$1,000 increase from last year.
- Ice Cream Social raised \$1,520, which was a \$300 increase over last year.
- PTO Membership dues raised \$4,500 @ \$15 per member.

• Memorial curriculum enhancements include Sounds Like Fun in science, and the PTO cut a check in the amount of \$1,500 for Dr. Michael Fowlin to talk to our seventh and eighth graders about the repercussions of bullying behavior.

#### Superintendent of Schools, Dr. Darren Petersen

- Thank you to PTO for all of its fundraisers, Back to School Night was well attended, and Special Services Meeting took place on 10/5.
- Department of Education engages students in thoughtful learning by using the following gaming principles: 1) everyone is a participant, 2) it feels like play, 3) allow for safe failure, since learners can simply try again, 4) everything is interconnected, and 5) challenge is constant.
- Teachers attended 5-6 workshops from yoga art, STEM centers, social media, and math on Professional Development Day on 10/9. Thank you to Mr. Parks for organizing it.
- For the teacher raffle, Dr. Petersen presented a "hamburger" lesson for kindergarten language arts and will prepare another language arts lesson in seventh grade.
- Pipe burst at Memorial School started on Sunday, 10/15.

# Principal of MES, Mr. Collier

- Pipe burst happened from a ruptured gasket and an inch of water covered the floors in the first and second grade classrooms. Expressive Arts gave their classrooms to first grade, and the Child Study Team and second grade moved to the gym. Teachers lost bookcases. Contractors sterilized and sealed the classrooms, removed base molding, tested the environment and will return on 10/25 to give a status update.
- Montvale Police Department will talk about Halloween Safety to students on 10/27 and 10/30. Memorial School Halloween Parade will take place on 10/31 at 2:15pm. It will start at the Community Entrance and end at the Kindergarten Annex. Kindergarten students will wear their costumes to school, and children in grades 1-4 will change into their costumes.

- Character Education Program consists of 15-20 teachers, and each month has a specific theme.
